

Resident Courses at EMI

E417 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Train-the-Trainer Course

The CERT program prepares neighborhood organizations to do vital emergency functions such as fire suppression, light search and rescue, and disaster medical operations. The CERT Train-the-Trainer prepares local instructors to deliver the 3-day course that teaches participants how to start a CERT program in their communities.

S301 Radiological Emergency Response Operations Course

This 5 ½-day performance-exercise-based course provides a realistic environment for training response and management of radiological incidents, including on-scene radiological monitoring, managing radiation exposure and contamination control, victim rescue and care techniques, and reporting procedures.



S302 Advanced Radiation Incident Operations Course

An advanced 5 ½-day course for individuals who need to refresh or improve radiological responder or manager skills. The course focuses on response plans and procedures for complex incidents, concentrating on organization and jurisdictional issues and planning considerations where all levels of government may be involved.

S425 Radiological Series Train-the-Trainer

This 4 ½-day course prepares instructors to deliver FEMA's radiological training to people who respond to events involving radiological material. These events include

terrorism, fixed facility incidents, and nuclear power plant and transportation accidents.

S915 Integrated Emergency Management Course (IEMC): Consequences of Terrorism

A 5-day exercise-based course that focuses on preparing for, responding to, and recovering from the emergency.

EMI Courses Taught by State Offices of Emergency Management

G190 Incident Command System (ICS) for Law Enforcement Personnel

This 12-hour course introduces police and other law enforcement personnel to ICS and provides opportunities for exercising the concepts learned.

G191 Incident Command System (ICS)/Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Interface

A 1½-day course that reviews ICS and EOC concepts and provides an opportunity to develop a working interface between the incident commander and the EOC.

G192 Incident Command System (ICS) for Public Works Officials

A 1½-day course that introduces public works personnel to ICS and provides opportunities for exercising the concepts learned.

G194 Incident Command System (ICS) for Public Officials Conference

A 1½-hour conference designed as a briefing for elected and appointed policy-level officials.



This conference provides public officials with an awareness of ICS as an effective management tool that can be adopted in managing emergency situations.

G195 Intermediate Incident Command System (ICS)

A 3-day course designed for officials from various disciplines (police, fire, EMS, medical examiner, etc.) of persons who might serve as supervisors in an ICS structure. Topics include organization and staffing, incident and event planning/staffing, organizing a response to an incident or a planned event, and incident resource management.

G196 Advanced Incident Command System (ICS)

A 2½-day course designed for officials from various disciplines (police, fire, EMS, medical examiner, etc.) who might serve as incident commander. Topics include command and general staff, unified command, major incident management, area command, and multi-agency coordination.



G120 Exercise Design Course

A 2-day course that enables participants to conduct community emergency management exercises to test the communities' emergency operations plans and to rehearse key response operations.

G130 Exercise Evaluation Course

A 2-day course that enables participants to manage exercise evaluation activities before, during, and following an exercise.

G202 Debris Management

The course provides State and local personnel, including public works directors, their staffs, and waste management personnel, an overview of issues and recommended actions necessary to manage debris-generating events.

G250.11 Continuity of Operations (COOP) Workshop in Emergency Management (WEM)

This 1-day workshop helps agencies plan for continuity of operations in the event that normal functions are disrupted or degraded by an emergency such as terrorist attack, catastrophic earthquake, hurricane, or nuclear attack.

G250.12 Senior Officials Workshop on Terrorism

A 1-day course for mayors and their cabinets focuses on terrorism preparedness policy issues. The course includes a 3-hour instructional module followed by a 3-hour exercise.

G310 Weapons of Mass Destruction

This series of facilitator-led courses is intended to help senior local government officials prepare for and improve their ability to manage and respond to mass casualty terrorism incidents.

Higher Education Course

Terrorism and Emergency Management
A college-level course covering various terrorism issues. Available as part of the FEMA Higher Education Project.

Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) Courses

Joint Information Center (JIC) Joint Information System (JIS) Course
A 24-hour course that introduces participants to the JIC/JIS concept and details the functions to be performed in establishing a single location for the dissemination of coordinated emergency information.

ACT FAST (Agent Characterization and Toxicity First Aid and Special Treatment)
An 8-hour course designed to prepare emergency medical personnel to recognize and provide first response treatment to persons accidentally exposed to nerve and blister agents.

National Fire Academy

In addition to the courses listed in this pamphlet, EMI's sister institution, the National Fire Academy (NFA), offers a comprehensive curriculum of courses to assist firefighters, emergency medical personnel, and other first responders to be prepared to deal with terrorist incidents. Independent Study Courses

IS3 Radiological Emergency Management
This course contains information on a variety of radiological topics including principles of radiation, nuclear threat and protective measures, nuclear power plants, radiological transportation accidents, and other radiological hazards.



IS195 Basic Incident Command System (ICS)
The course provides participants with an understanding of the fundamentals of ICS.

IS301 Radiological Emergency Response
This course is a prerequisite to EMI resident course S301, Radiological Emergency Response Operations. This course enables participants to demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of radiological protection and response principles, guidelines, and regulations that will prepare them for the operations course.

IS330 Refresher Course for Radiological Response
A videotape and workbook course that reviews monitoring techniques, protective actions, and radiation information for all types of radiation emergencies.

IS346 Orientation to Hazardous Materials for Medical Personnel
This self-study course prepares staff to deal with patients involved in hazardous materials or radiological incidents.

G320 Fundamentals Course for Radiological Response Teams
This 3-day course teaches assigned State, Tribal, and local radiological responders the essentials of planning for and managing a radiological incident.

G346 Hospital Emergency Department Management of Hazardous Materials Accidents
A 1-day course introducing medical personnel to procedures for handling accident victims exposed to radiation and other hazardous materials.

G357 Emergency Response to Criminal and Terrorist Incidents
A 6-hour course that sensitizes responders to the special issues involved in responding to an event that may involve a crime. Topics such as preservation of evidence are covered in detail.

G386 Mass Fatalities Incident Response
A 2-day course designed to prepare local and State response personnel to manage incidents such as terrorism events and plane crashes involving large numbers of fatalities.
