The Journal of Security, Intelligence, and Resilience Education (JSIRE) is publishing a Special Edition, Theory to *Practice,* in December 2023. In essay form, the Special Edition will capture how academics from homeland security, intelligence, law enforcement, emergency management, public health, and related fields develop and use theory in their courses, programs, and research.
